

# Tour to revive heritage

handernagore: Some memers of a non-governmental oranisation (NGO) that is workng to secure the history and evive the cultural heritage of Chandernagore are launching tour to give visitors a feel of he town with a rich past.

'It is not enough to save the built heritage. One needs to jurture the intangible hertage, too," said Krishna Gupta of Chandernagore Sanskriti, who is part of the team that has launched Tour de Chan-

On behalf of the NGO, we have identified some areas to work on, like the Phorashdanga taant (loom). We have spoken to some weaver families, who are still fluent in French Chandernagore was under French rule till 1954), as well is the Crafts Council of India. We are urging them to resume production so we can help hem market the dhuti and ari they were famous for. his tour will be a showcase or the work we are doing."

The town by the Hooghly iver, about 45km from Calcuta, is steeped in history. "But vith most young residents blivious to the past, Chanderagore is losing its identity. ne way of stemming this tide to bring tourists in. That ray, youngsters will feel ennused to learn about their wn town so they can act as rofessional guides. They will lso get exposure by interactig with outsiders, including oreigners," said Basabi Pal, ead of the French departent of Chandernagore Govmment College, who plans to ganise heritage workshops r students after classes.

knowledge gap that exists in the travel agencies that come calling sporadically with tourist groups. "This tour has qualified people with local connection involved."

Metro was part of the outfit's inaugural tour and the itinerary revealed an equal stress on Chandernagore's link with the freedom movement as on its French past. "Since the town was under French rule, those fighting the British could operate here with relative immunity," said Parashar Basu, urban planner and architect, who was the general secretary of Alliance Française de Calcutta in the 1990s.

The first stop was Prabar-

tak Sangha, founded in 1910 by social reformer Motilal Roy. Pradip Banerjee, secretary of Prabartak Aponalay, the boys' home run by the trust, provided an insight into the Sangha's activities.

"Every prominent leader of the day has set foot here -Subhas Chandra Bose, Sarojini Naidu, C.R. Das.... Gandhiji came twice, in 1925 and 1926. The pistol to kill Naren Gossain, who had turned approver and deposed against Sri Aurobindo, Barin Ghosh and others in the Alipore bomb case or the bomb used in the assassination attempt on viceroy Lord Hardinge were all manufactured in the house

of the Soms next door."

Chandernagore lacks a decent place for tourists to stay. "We are in talks with some families who have agreed to offer rooms for homestay," said Gupta. The company is also exploring possibilities of offering a river cruise.

Rafael Moschellat, a young Frenchman staying in Calcutta, was awestruck by the French inscriptions on plaques on Joraghat and the clock tower. He said the current generation in France had not heard of the town at all. "I only knew Chandernagore to be the surname of French historian Francoise Chandernagore! This is quite a discovery.'

## Focus on heritage hurdles

Calcutta: The owners of a number of old properties along the Hooghly, some of which have the heritage tag, sat down with architects, planners and conservation workers at Chandernagore on Sunday to discuss how to preserve and protect the structures.

Most of the owner-custodians said lack of funds and inadequate hands were coming in the way of preserving the structures.

The discussion was organised by the Hugli River of Cultures Pilot Project, which has been set up by 20 people and aims to document heritage and conserve built heritage.

Neline Mondal from the Mondalbati in Chandernagore's Gondalpara, a mansion built in 1741, spoke about the difficulty in maintaining such an old house. "There is an issue of finance. Also, the walls are so damp that sometimes they become unsafe," she said. The event was held in the

The event was held in the house built by businessman and philanthropist Harihar Sett around 135 years ago.

Sett around 135 years ago.
Goutam Sett, a successor of
Harihar, said: "You need a lot
of money to maintain such
houses. Besides, there is always a threat from land

sharks. Even if the owner wants to preserve it, the situation often forces him or her to think otherwise."

The West Bengal Heritage Commission had in 2018 declared the Sett house a heritage property.

The Hugli River of Cultures Pilot Project, funded by the University of Liverpool and IIT Kharagpur, aims to devise a strategy for Mondal, Sett and others like them to save their heritage.

"We will create a manage-

"We will create a management strategy for tangible and intangible heritage along the 35km stretch of the Hooghly river between Bandel and Barrackpore," said Purba Chatterjee, a senior volunteer of the project.

Five European nations had set up colonies along the stretch — the Portugese in Bandel, the Dutch in Chinsurah, the Danes in Serampore, the French in Chandernagore and the British in Barracknore.

While Bandel, Chinsurah, Serampore and Chandernagore are in Hooghly district, Barrackpore is in North 24-Parganas. "These places have some built heritage that represent both Indian and European styles. The façade of these buildings have an European architecture while inside one can find thakurdalans. We need to preserve this heritage," said Ian Magedera, a lecturer in French at the University of Liverpool who was in Chandernagore on Sunday.

"Our project will document the heritage, raise awareness among people about heritage and also tell them about showcasing the heritage,"he said.




